

BC Milk Marketing Board - From QTAR submission June 30, 2017:

The current GEP provides a new entrant, with no previously owned quota, the opportunity to receive 13.7 kg/day of CDQ, with an additional opportunity to obtain 5.5 kg/day if the equivalent is purchased. The Milk Board has successfully started 76 producers (includes regularized producers) since August 2004, with 88% of these producers currently still in operation on April 1, 2017.

Alberta Milk – 25 kilograms of quota available on loan to a maximum of two applicants each per year.

Producers receive 2 kg of new entrant quota for every 1 kg they buy through the Quota Exchange.

Applications are accepted from Jan. 1 to March 31 each year. Successful applicants will receive quota starting the first day of the month when they start shipping milk. Clawback of the new entrant quota loan starts on the seventh year. The quota loan will be reduced by 20 per cent per year until it is fully clawed back. SaskMilk – 15 to 20 kg of quota on a kilo-for-kilo basis for each kilogram of quota the new producer purchases through the Quota Exchange. The quota does not have to be reimbursed, and producers will receive quota as soon as they begin production. Applications are accepted on an ongoing basis. SaskMilk's Board determines the amount of quota that's available to the program every year, so the number of successful applicants in a year can fluctuate. Dairy Farmers of Manitoba – 20 kg of daily butterfat quota on a kilo-for-kilo basis. Applications are accepted in September. The successful applicant is chosen in December or January. By August, the applicant would have received their 20 kg of quota. The quota does not have to be reimbursed. For more information, visit www.milk.mb.ca.

Dairy Farmers of New Brunswick – 12 kg of quota available on loan on a kilo-for-kilo basis. Producers start reimbursing the quota on the sixth year at the rate of 1 kg per year. For more information, visit www.nbmilk.org.

Dairy Farmers of Nova Scotia – 12 to 16 kg of total production quota to one successful applicant. DFNS will loan quota on a kilo-for-kilo basis. Producers start reimbursing the quota on the 11th year at 1 kg per year. Applications are accepted between Aug. 1 to Sept. 30. The successful applicant will be chosen by Oct. 31 and can receive assistance on Jan. 1 of the following year. For more information, visit www.dfns.ca.

Dairy Farmers of Prince Edward Island – 16 kg of quota available on loan to one applicant on a kilo-for-kilo basis. Applications are accepted every month. Producers start reimbursing the quota on the 11th year at 1 kg per year. For more information, visit www.dfpei.pe.ca.

Dairy Farmers of Ontario – 112 kilograms of quota available on loan per year. DFO will match from 12 to 16 kg of quota to each successful applicant. This year, DFO has given priority access to three new entrants who plan on shipping organic milk. As a result, there are only four positions available.
